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## **SUMMARY: FY 2010 OVERSEAS CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS**

### The bill:

- Provides \$128.2 billion in new discretionary spending authority for the Department of Defense for functions under the Defense Subcommittee's jurisdiction for overseas deployments and other activities
- Provides \$4 billion in Special Transfer Authority
- Fully funds current deployments in Iraq and Afghanistan
- Fully funds the increase of 22,000 to Army end strength

### Title I – Military Personnel: \$14.1 billion

- Provides pay and allowances for mobilized Reservists and Guardsmen and special pay and allowances for deployed active duty personnel
- Supports required Pre- and Post-Mobilization Training for Reserve and Guard units

### Title II – Operation and Maintenance: \$86.9 billion

- Fully funds key readiness programs critical to prepare forces for combat operations and other missions: OPTEMPO flying hours and steaming days, depot maintenance, training, spare parts, and base operations
- Includes an additional \$329 million for fuel to begin providing relief for the projected fiscal year 2010 fuel shortfall
- Provides \$1.2 billion for the Commander's Emergency Response Program
- Provides \$6.6 billion for the Afghanistan Security Forces Fund to train and equip Afghan Security Forces and assist the government in assuming greater responsibility for its nation's security

Title III – Procurement:

\$22.2 billion

Aircraft

- Adds funds for an additional nine F/A-18E/F Super Hornet aircraft
- Funds the request for two AH-1Z helicopters
- Funds two projected battle losses of UH-60 Black Hawk, CH-47 Chinook, and AH-64 Apache helicopters
- Funds the request for Directed Infrared Countermeasures for Navy aircraft
- Funds one C-130J to replace a combat loss
- Fully funds the request for Army C-12 EMARSS reconnaissance aircraft
- Provides requested funding for six battle loss replacement OH-58 Kiowa Warrior helicopters
- Deletes funding for 12 MQ-1C Sky Warrior UAVs due to lack of production capacity
- Funds modifications for the MQ-1 Predator and MQ-9 Reaper unmanned aerial vehicles

Weapons/Missiles

- Provides a total of \$1.9 billion for the purchase of ammunition and missiles to replenish war expenditures and reserve stockpiles

Vehicles/Force Protection

- Adds \$1.2 billion for additional MRAP-All Terrain Vehicles (M-ATV)
- Funds Common Remotely Operated Weapons Stations for Army vehicles
- Reduces the Bradley Fighting Vehicle modification program reflecting funds provided in the FY 2009 Supplemental
- Funds the Army's Heavy and Medium Tactical Vehicle Programs
- Funds the High Mobility Multi-Purpose Wheeled Vehicle program
- Funds Counter-Rocket, Artillery and Mortar Systems
- Defers additional funding for the Army's Modification of In-Service Equipment due to availability of prior year funds

Other

- Buys 20 Army Force Provider deployable facility modules to replace equipment lost or degraded in theater.

Title IV – Research, Development, Test and Evaluation:

\$293.6 million

Title V – Revolving and Management Funds:

\$412 million

- Includes \$15.3 million in the Transportation Working Capital Fund for the transportation of fallen heroes.

Title VI – Other Department of Defense Programs:

Defense Health Programs \$1.6 billion

Drug Interdiction and Counter-drug Activities \$354 million

- For drug interdiction and counter-drug activities in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Central Asia
- Provides \$29 million above the President's budget request

Office of the Inspector General \$8.9 million

Joint Improvised Explosive Device Defeat Organization (JIEDDO) \$2 billion

- Transfers \$66 million to Service OCO accounts for proper execution

Title VII – General Provisions

- Includes language which prohibits the transfer, release, or incarceration of any individual who was detained as of October 1, 2009, at Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, to or within the United States or its territories which is consistent with language previously adopted by the Senate
