

FY2017 DISASTER RELIEF AND RECOVERY SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

The FY2017 Further Continuing and Security Assistance Appropriations Act includes \$4.1 billion in disaster relief and recovery programs funding to help states and communities recover from natural disasters, including severe flooding, drought and hurricane damage. The majority of this funding supports flood recovery efforts in Louisiana, West Virginia, and Texas, as well as recovery efforts from Hurricane Matthew in North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida. The measure would provide aid to 45 states and territories.

Title I, Section 185: Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies – \$206.1 million

- \$103.1 million– Emergency Watershed Protection
- \$103.0 million – Emergency Conservation Program

Title I, Section 186: Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies – \$74.7 million

- \$74.7 million – NASA Construction and Environmental programs

Title I, Sections 187-190: Energy and Water Development – \$1.0 billion

- \$54.8 million – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Construction
- \$290.7 million – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Mississippi River and Tributaries
- \$259.6 million – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Operations & Maintenance
- \$419.9 million – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies

Title I, Section 191 and Section 192: Transportation, Housing and Urban Development – \$2.8 billion

- \$1.0 billion – Emergency Relief Highways
- \$1.8 billion – Community Development Block Grants
