BILL HIGHLIGHTS

- Department of State and USAID Operations \$12.5 billion for State and USAID operations, including \$6.1 billion to strengthen embassy security and ensure the safety of U.S. diplomats and development specialists.
- o **International Security Assistance** a total of \$8.9 billion for critical assistance for foreign military training and education programs, peacekeeping operations, counterterrorism and nonproliferation programs, and financing for military equipment for U.S. partners and allies.
- Supports Key Allies
 - o <u>Israel</u> \$3.3 billion in military assistance for Israel and \$5 million for refugee resettlement in Israel.
 - o <u>Jordan</u> \$1.65 billion in economic and military assistance for Jordan.
 - o <u>Ukraine</u> \$448m in economic and military assistance for Ukraine.
- O Global Health Programs a total of \$9.3 billion to bolster global heath and prevent future pandemics, an increase of \$161.1 million above FY20 enacted level. Of this total, \$3.3 billion is for USAID health programs and \$5.9 billion is for the Department of State.
- o **U.S. Development Finance Corporation (DFC)** \$821 million in support of the DFC's work to engage the private sector in development needs in strategically important regions globally, an increase of \$520 million over FY20 enacted level.
- O Countering Chinese Influence Fund \$300 million to combat malign Chinese influence and promote transparency and accountability in projects associated with the People's Republic of China's debt-trap diplomacy and the Belt and Road Initiative.
- o **Countering Russian Influence Fund** \$290 million to counter Russian influence and its attempts to sow distrust in democratic institutions worldwide.
- o **Democracy Programs** \$2.5 billion for democracy programs, an increase of \$68 million above FY20 enacted level.
- Migration and Refugee Assistance \$3.4 billion to maintain the long-held U.S. commitment to protection and addressing the needs of refugees impacted by conflict and other natural and manmade disasters.
- Protects Life maintains the Mexico City Policy and other provisions relating to abortion, including the Tiahrt, Helms, and Kemp-Kasten Amendments, and caps family planning and reproductive health programs at \$461 million.
