Town of Stonington, ME	The town of Stonington, ME is looking to purchase a strategic waterfront parcel of land and expand its working waterfront access to support the fishing industry. This parcel also would provide the town the opportunity for the critical expansion of its wastewater treatment system and allow the town to meet federal EPA mandates to improve testing and treatment standards.	Town of Stonington, ME ME	\$394
Maine 4-H Foundation	Maine 4-H, working with the University of Maine, proposes to buy the Magic Latern in Bridgton, keep it operating as a movie theater and pub (providing ongoing revenue), and also transform it into an Innovation Lab and Learning Center to support the students in Bridgton and the surrounding communities. The project will add 8-10 jobs with benefits and 20-25 paid workforce college/HS internships annually. Bridgton is a rural, underserved area, with no UMaine presence within an hour's drive.	Town of Bridgton, ME ME	\$450
Town of Patten, ME	The town of Patten is looking to upgrade the community center building in order to have it be inhabitable. The project includes electrical and structural upgrades, as well as upgrades to meet the current codes associated with fire safety and ADA compliance.	Town of Patten, ME ME	\$300
Harrison Food Bank	The requested funds are to finish the Harrison Food Bank and Community Center, including interior and exterior upgrades. Facility will also serve as a shelter and food distribution hub for the town.	Cumberland County ME	\$388
Millinocket Memorial Library	The library seeks funding for Phase III of the library renovation project, which includes the addition of a roof canopy to create an outside children's space, exterior site work, a solar array on the roof, and external signage.	Town of Millinocket, ME ME	\$120
Town of Greenville, ME	The Town of Greenville is looking to upgrade their restrooms at the public wharf, the only public restrooms on Moosehead Lake, providing services to thousands of visitors. The facility was built in 1995 and is beginning to show its age. As part of the upgrades, the facility would be made ADA-compliant.	Town of Greenville, ME ME	\$38
Town of St. Albans, ME	To improve the Town Hall building to make it handicap accessible. The project requires the installation of an elevator and entrance to the building and major improvements to a bathroom that is accessible to the public.	Town of St. Albans, ME ME	\$117
Town of Georgetown, ME	The town of Georgetown, ME will use funds to renovate the 1800's era First Baptist Church, focusing on creating a safe, accessible and technologically advanced community meeting space to accommodate a variety of needs. As part of our town's resilient response to the challenges of the future, the federal funding will support foundation and groundwork, new HVAC, ADA bathrooms, new entrances, and interior remodeling to fully upgrade the historic building and equip it in such a way that both in-person and hybrid/virtual gatherings are possible.
