Vermont Housing & Conservation Board	Funding will redevelop the Historic Brattleboro High School to produce 22 new affordable apartments with town offices on the lower levels.	Brattleboro VT	\$750
Vermont Center for Emerging Technologies (VCET)	Funding will support recovery and economic resiliency loans to support business development statewide to support emerging companies.	Burlington VT	\$6,000
Flynn Center for the Performing Arts, Ltd.	: Funding will enable the historic Flynn Center to make facility improvements to address public health concerns, including replacing an aging air filtration system. The Flynn Center is a cultural and economic engine for Vermont and Burlington and is undergoing a once-in-a-generation building revitalization to strengthen the 90-year-old historic building. This is a critical upgrade in its larger revitalization plan that is needed to protect the health and safety of thousands of schoolchildren and adults who attend events at the Burlington landmark annually. Vermont Agency of Transportation	Funding will provide for the extension of the runway at the state-owned Franklin County Airport.	Franklin County VT	\$2,000
Broad Brook Community Center, Inc.	Funding will repair a former grange building in the Guilford Village Center. The community center will provide space for public use, including a community kitchen, exercise and dance classes, and community performances.	Guilford VT	\$315
Burlington International Airport	Funding will extend the airport's south taxiway to its general aviation ramp and provide an apron for the parking of aircraft in the airport's development area.	South Burlington VT	\$5,000
Burlington International Airport	Funding will provide a new jet bridge and passenger hold room area at the south end of the currently constructed terminal development project to accommodate larger aircraft anticipated at the airport and meet FAA criteria for hold room capacity.	South Burlington VT	\$2,000
Springfield Regional Development Corporation	Funding will create a high-tech business incubator and community space at the former Park Street School in Springfield, Vermont.	Springfield VT	\$3,000
Preservation Trust of Vermont	Funding will provide technical assistance and financial support to community supported enterprises, providing an opportunity for small Vermont towns to simultaneously retain lynchpin village center businesses, such as general stores, and ensure that historic buildings stay in use and continue to contribute to village character.
