19 “(ii) shall be in addition to the

11 **SEC. 3001. SHORT TITLE.**

12 This division may be cited as the “Surface Transpor-
13 tation Extension Act of 2026”.

14 **SEC. 3002. DEFINITIONS.**

15 In this division:

16 (1) COVERED LAW.—The term “covered law”
17 means any of the following:

18 (A) Division A, division B, and division C
19 of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
20 (Public Law 117–58; 135 Stat. 429).

21 (B) Titles I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII,
22 XI, and XXIV of the FAST Act (Public Law
23 114–94; 129 Stat. 1312).

24 (C) Division A, division B, subtitle A of
25 title I and title II of division C, and division E

1 of MAP-21 (Public Law 112-141; 126 Stat.
2 405).

3 (D) Titles I, II, and III of the SAFETEA-
4 LU Technical Corrections Act of 2008 (Public
5 Law 110-244; 122 Stat. 1572).

6 (E) Titles I, II, III, IV, V, and VI of
7 SAFETEA-LU (Public Law 109-59; 119 Stat.
8 1144).

9 (F) Titles I, II, III, IV, and V of the
10 Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century
11 (Public Law 105-178; 112 Stat. 107).

12 (G) Titles II, III, and IV of the National
13 Highway System Designation Act of 1995

24 (2) EXTENSION END DATE.—The term “exten-
25 sion end date” means December 11, 2026.

1 (3) EXTENSION FRACTION.—The term “exten-
2 sion fraction” means the quotient, expressed as a
3 fraction, obtained by dividing—

4 (A) the number of days in the extension
5 period; by

6 (B) 365.

7 (4) EXTENSION PERIOD.—The term “extension
8 period” means the period that begins on October 1,
9 2026, and ends on the extension end date.

10 (5) HIGHWAY ACCOUNT.—The term “Highway
11 Account” means the portion of the Highway Trust
12 Fund that is not the Mass Transit Account.

13 (6) MASS TRANSIT ACCOUNT.—The term “Mass
14 Transit Account” means the portion of the Highway
15 Trust Fund established under section 9503(e)(1) of
16 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

17 **TITLE I—SURFACE**
18 **TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS**

19 **SEC. 3101. EXTENSION OF FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPOR-**
20 **TATION PROGRAMS.**

21 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as otherwise provided in
22 this division, the requirements, authorities, conditions, eli-
23 gibilities, limitations, and other provisions authorized
24 under the covered laws, which would otherwise expire on
25 or cease to apply after September 30, 2026, are incor-

1 porated by reference and shall continue in effect through
2 the extension end date.

3 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—

4 (1) HIGHWAY TRUST FUND.—

5 (A) HIGHWAY ACCOUNT.—There is author-
6 ized to be appropriated from the Highway Ac-
7 count for fiscal year 2027, for each program
8 with respect to which amounts are authorized
9 to be appropriated from such account for fiscal
10 year 2026, an amount equal to the extension
11 fraction of the amount authorized for appro-
12 priation with respect to the program from such
13 account under the covered laws for fiscal year
14 2026.

15 (B) MASS TRANSIT ACCOUNT.—There is
16 authorized to be appropriated from the Mass
17 Transit Account for fiscal year 2027, for each
18 program with respect to which amounts are au-
19 thorized to be appropriated from such account
20 for fiscal year 2026, an amount equal to the ex-
21 tension fraction of the amount authorized for
22 appropriation with respect to the program from
23 such account under the covered laws for fiscal
24 year 2026.

1 (2) GENERAL FUND.—There is authorized to be
2 appropriated for fiscal year 2027, for each program
3 under the covered laws with respect to which
4 amounts are authorized to be appropriated for fiscal
5 year 2026 from an account other than the Highway
6 Account or the Mass Transit Account, an amount
7 that is not less than the extension fraction of the
8 amount authorized for appropriation with respect to
9 the program under the covered laws for fiscal year
10 2026.

11 (c) USE OF FUNDS.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—Amounts authorized to be
13 appropriated for fiscal year 2027 with respect to a
14 program under subsection (b) shall be distributed,
15 administered, limited, and made available for obliga-
16 tion in the same manner as amounts authorized to
17 be appropriated with respect to the program for fis-
18 cal year 2026 under the covered laws.

19 (2) APPORTIONMENT NOTICE TO STATES.—Sec-
20 tion 104(e)(2) of title 23, United States Code, shall
21 not apply for fiscal year 2027.

22 (d) OBLIGATION LIMITATION.—A program for which
23 amounts are authorized to be appropriated under sub-
24 section (b)(1) shall be subject to a limitation on obliga-
25 tions for fiscal year 2027 in an amount equal to the exten-

1 sion fraction of the limitation on obligations for the pro-
2 gram for fiscal year 2026 and in the same manner as the
3 limitation applicable with respect to the program for fiscal
4 year 2026.

5 **SEC. 3102. APPALACHIAN REGIONAL COMMISSION.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—During the extension period, sec-
7 tion 14703 of title 40, United States Code, shall be ap-
8 plied—

9 (1) in subsection (a)(6), by substituting “2027”
10 for “2026”;

11 (2) in subsection (c), by substituting “2027”
12 for “2026”; and

13 (3) in subsection (d), by substituting “2027”
14 for “2026”.

15 (b) TERMINATION.—During the extension period,
16 section 14704 of title 40, United States Code, shall be
17 applied by substituting “2027” for “2026”.

18 **SEC. 3103. SPORT FISHING.**

19 During the extension period, section 4 of the Dingell-
20 Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act (16 U.S.C. 777c)
21 shall be applied—

22 (1) in subsection (a), in the matter preceding
23 paragraph (1), by substituting “2027” for “2026”;
24 and

25 (2) in subsection (b)—

1 (A) in paragraph (1)(A), in the first sen-
2 tence, by substituting “2027” for “2026”; and
3 (B) in paragraph (2)(A), in the first sen-
4 tence, by substituting “2027” for “2026”.

5 **SEC. 3104. EXTENSION OF CERTAIN FUNDING.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 118(b)
7 of title 23, United States Code, any funds authorized from
8 the Highway Trust Fund (other than the Mass Transit
9 Account) under section 11101 of the Infrastructure In-
10 vestment and Jobs Act (Public Law 117–58; 135 Stat.
11 443) for a program described in subsection (b) that would
12 otherwise lapse on September 30, 2026, shall be available
13 until September 30, 2027.

14 (b) PROGRAM DESCRIBED.—A program referred to
15 in subsection (a) is a program other than a program for
16 which funding is apportioned under section 104(b) or sec-
17 tion 130(f) of title 23, United States Code.
